

Expected behaviours

1 Be kind to yourself and others

Respect your own limits and those of others. Keep in mind that everyone has different abilities, limitations, values and aspirations.

2 Communicate openly and respectfully

Actively listen and be open to other's points of view. Ask questions instead of criticizing and, when necessary, critique ideas, not people.

3 Create an inclusive environment for everyone

Give everyone a chance to contribute and and express their ideas. Make sure to use a language that can be understood by everyone around you. Don't forget to include indigenous community members in your fieldwork and scientific conversations.

4 Act respectfully at all times

Use appropriate language, both verbally and written. Inappropriate and offensive language, images, innuendos, gestures and jokes will not be tolerated.

5 Defuse problematic and tense situations as quickly as possible

Make it clear to others how you feel. Keep in mind that actions and words can be offensive to others, even when the intent is not to hurt. If a problematic situation arises, make sure to listen to others, offer a sincere apology if need be, and commit to future improvement.

6 Respect the safety and communal life rules of the stations

Keep the premises and equipments clean and in good condition for future users. Participate voluntarily in communal tasks.



Expected behaviours

Act as an ambassador of the CEN at all times

Be aware that working in the North and with First Peoples is a privilege. Always act with respect for the land and the community. The CEN has a special relationship of trust with the people of the North which we must all work together to maintain and develop in a positive manner.

No form of violence, harassment or discrimination is tolerated at the Center for Northern Studies

Unacceptable behaviours include comments, gestures or jokes about gender, ethnic or cultural origin, religion, ability or physical appearance. Indifference, a form of silent discrimination, is also unacceptable. Any form of sexual misconduct or harassment, including sexual images in common areas, is also prohibited at CEN's research stations. Any violation of this code of conduct will be addressed by CEN management and may result in sanctions such as: ineligibility for CEN's events, ineligibility for CEN's grants and awards, denied access to research stations or membership revocation.

This Code of Conduct complements existing local rules and laws. If you witness or experience inappropriate behaviour, it is important to speak promptly with the person involved, contact a trusted person or person in authority for advice, report it to CEN management or file a complaint with the police.
